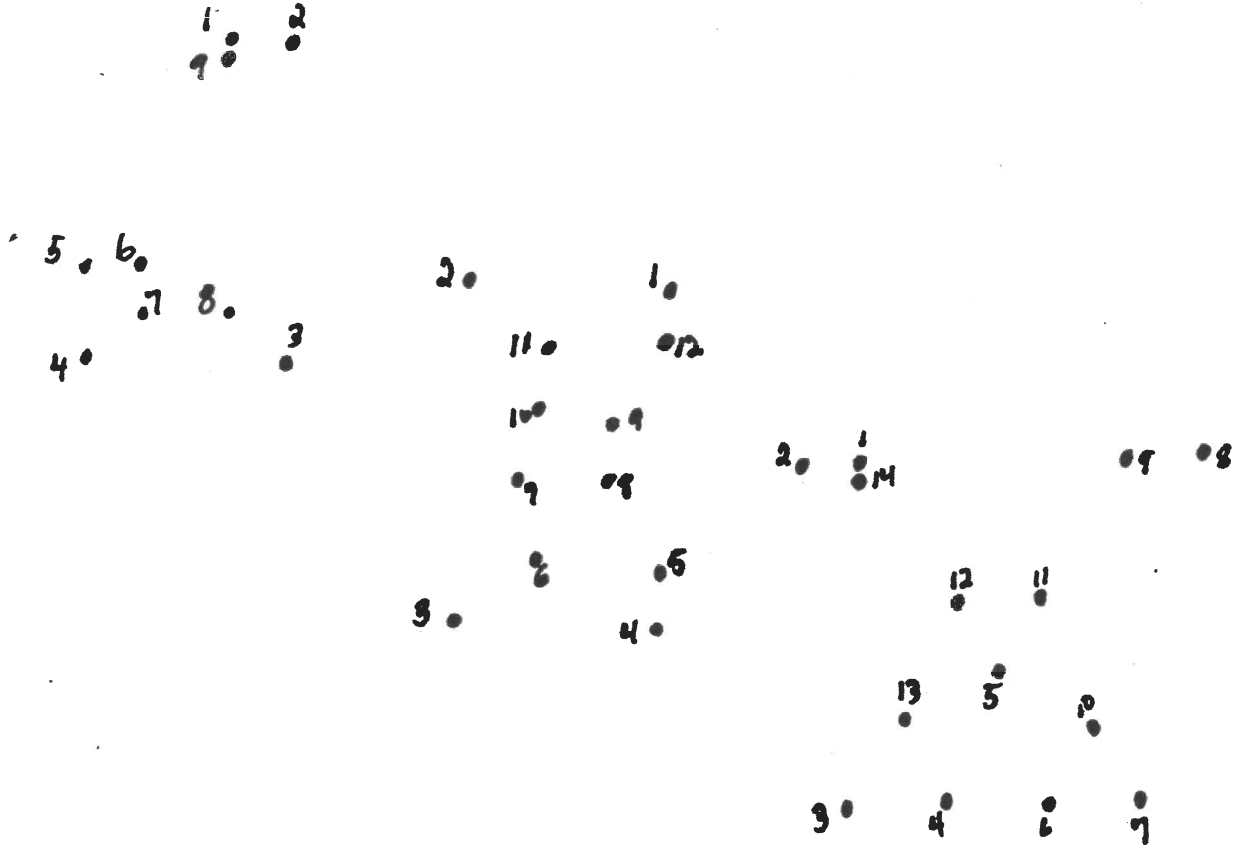

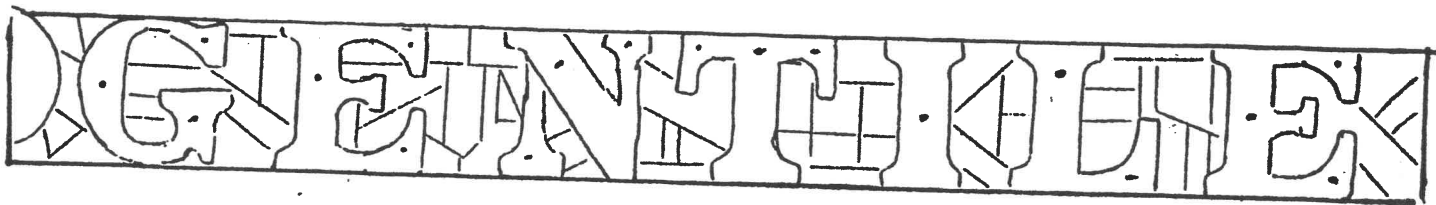

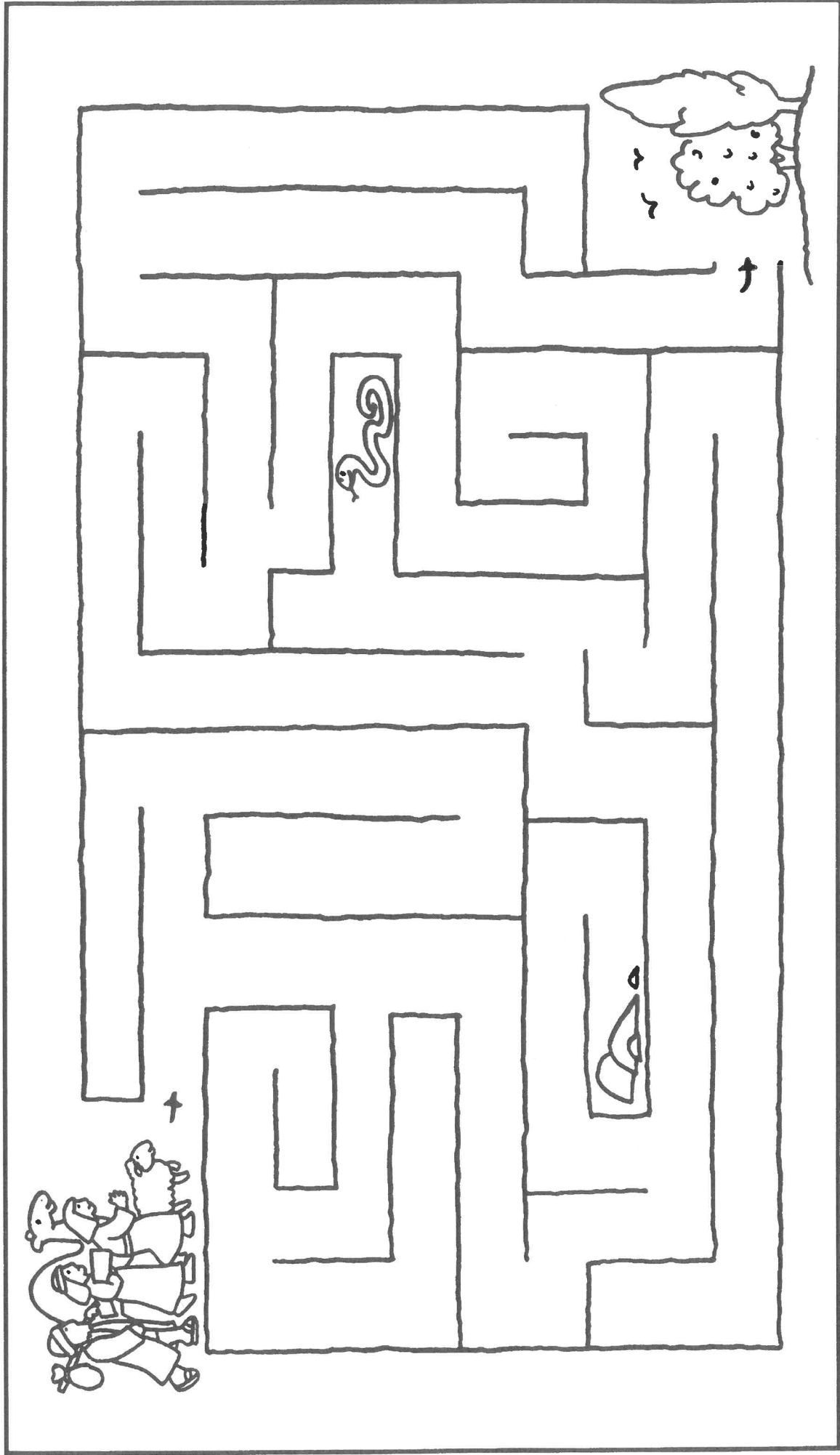
OPPOSITES IN GOD'S WORD
